Moses Pulop, PHF

The presentation of Paul Harris Fellow recognition is The Rotary Foundation's way of expressing its appreciation for a substantial contribution to its humanitarian and educational programs. It is named for our founder, Paul Harris, a Chicago lawyer who started Rotary International with three business associates in 1905. Rotarians often designate a Paul Harris Fellow as a tribute to a person whose life demonstrates a shared purpose with the objectives of the Rotary Foundation. Tonight we have the honour and pleasure of recognising Moses Pulop as he becomes a Paul Harris Fellow.

Moses was designated to receive this recognition as a special expression of appreciation from the Rotary Club of Mt Martha.

A world of peace and goodwill comes closer to reality tonight as Moses becomes a Paul Harris Fellow. It is because of gifts like one made in Moses honour that The Rotary Foundation is able to carry out an array of programs that achieve beneficial changes in our world: improved living conditions, increased food production, better education, wider availability of treatment and rehabilitation for sick and disabled, new channels for the flow of international understanding and brighter hopes for peace. A contribution to The Rotary Foundation is an investment in the ideal of goodwill, peace and understanding. That is an ideal held high by Rotarians the world over, and one that Moses clearly shares. Working with such individuals of goodwill, we believe the ideal will become a reality.

You have heard tonight some of Moses story and we have been so inspired with Moses vision for his village including the funding of his nieces and nephews Education.

Two years ago in early 2018, Komea and Mendi suffered massive earthquakes that cut the Southern Highlands Roads. Moses travelled to Komea soon after and helped set up the Komea Community Committee and signed up seven elders including his brother Timothy a teacher and clan leader.

Unicef provided them with water tanks as earthquake relief but no means to install them. Our Club with the aid of a District Grant provided assistance with locally sourced pipework, downpipe and guttering to enable water harvesting of every steel roof in the village. Last year Moses friend who is the Water Engineer from Yarra Valley prepared a detailed design for water supply from the springs to the village. The rest is history, with a \$50K donation from the International Laboure Organisation (Japan), the challenge accepted with 3 km's of poly pipe and more tanks, concrete pads, and stand pipes with the work completed in late 2019. Late next year Moses will lead a team of carpenters and plumbers to Komea to build basic homes with steel rooves to expand water harvesting.

Your encourager and mentor through these past few years has been our own Roger Skipsey and we acknowledge him as well.

It gives me great pleasure, Moses to present to you the emblems of appreciation given to a Paul Harris Fellow – a certificate, and pin. Please accept our congratulations and sincere thanks, for your commitment to our common goals of world understanding and peace.

YOUR ROTARY FOUNDATION AT WORK IN THE WORLD

Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced on 22 January 2020 that their long-term fundraising partnership, which generates up to \$150 million annually for polio eradication, will continue. Under the agreement, Rotary is committed to raising \$50 million a year over the next three years, and each dollar will be matched with an additional two dollars by the Gates Foundation.

At the 2020 Rotary International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, Bill Gates told incoming District Governors that the partnership with Rotary needs to continue. "The Gates Foundation's longstanding partnership with Rotary has been vital to fighting polio," Gates said. "That's why we're extending our funding match, so every dollar that Rotary raises is met with two more." He added, "I believe that together, we can make eradication a reality." The funding will support polio eradication efforts such as disease surveillance, technical assistance, and operational support for immunization activities.

The partnership between Rotary and the Gates Foundation has yielded \$2 billion, and Rotarians have given countless volunteer hours to fight polio since Rotary started its PolioPlus program in 1985.
