When I asked him what he thought about how we could increase and maintain our members he said that his advice on membership was to focus on ensuring that people are having a good time, that if they feel that they are making a difference and they're getting good fellowship and friendship out of being a member of Rotary they will or join. thank you, Ray it was a most enlightening talk.

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CHAIRPERSON AT ORDINARY MEETINGS OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF MT. MARTHA

Preamble

For the Rotary year 2021-22, each Chairperson will carry out the role for the 2 weekly meeting - 1st and 3rd weeks of each month unless another member has brought the Guest Speaker, in that case, the member will be Chairperson on that night. The Secretary will coordinate the organisation of the Chairperson role which will be cross referenced with the Program speaker's topics.

If they are unable to attend it will be up to the designated chair to find a replacement for the evening. The role of the Front of House (FoH) currently undertaken by Rob Davies and the Chairperson are closely related and it is expected that the Chairperson and FoH will communicate with each other.

CHAIRPERSON DUTIES

Objectives

- \Rightarrow Together with FoH the role ensure that the evening meeting is set up and well organised and coordinated.
- ⇒ Check with the President beforehand if there are any planned changes to the usual routine
- ⇒ Chair requests the Front of house to use the gong to call the meeting to order
- ⇒ Ensure that meetings start on time using an agenda (running sheet) and keep to timing. In Zoom you may give verbal prompts if required.
- ⇒ Conduct the events of each club meeting ensuring that the meeting has some membership engagement and activities, as well as introducing and thanking the speakers.
- ⇒ An ideas/activities list will be provided to Chairs to be used if necessary

Specific Responsibilities

- Ensure the Guest Speaker is appropriately greeted upon arrival,
- introduced to the President, provide a free drink, and make the speaker feel comfortable and thank them for coming
- Designate seating for the Guest Speaker next to the President and yourself.
- The chairperson will host the evening, introducing the President who will welcome everyone and too members who have something to say or report at the meeting.
- Introduce the speaker and have a short bio provided by Program Organiser
- Coordinate some members activities before or after the speaker
- Have gifts available for Guest Speakers
- After the talk thank them and provide them with the designated gift.
- Assist with pack away club equipment after each meeting if required.
















Rotary Anniversaries
