

ROTARIANS AGAINST MALARIA (RAM) UPDATE









RAM in Partner Countries

Papua New Guinea (PNG) (D9620):

Global Grant project 2016222 New Ireland Malaria Elimination Program- Outreach Response Team Development. This project was initiated by RAM Australia and adopted by RC Kippa Ring-North Lakes (as International Sponsor) with assistance from District 9620. RAM Australia donated 42% of the total Rotary GG funding. Commencement has been delayed by the pandemic and other difficulties including the withdrawal of matching funds from the New Ireland Province Provincial Health Authority. The GG is now terminated and DDFs returned to TRF. The cash contributions are held by the RC Kippa Ring-North Lakes and will be used as soon as a relevant project is proposed.

The Solomon Islands:

Malaria cases have continued to increase since 2015. RAM Australia and RAM Solomon Islands commenced the Active Case Detection (ACD) program in April 2023 after two-years of careful planning and with delays to implementation due to the pandemic. RAM was assisted by Dr Kevin Palmer in developing the project design. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between RC Honiara, RAM, Honiara City Council, and Pasifiki HR in February. We now have a team of 12 public health/nurse graduates who are trained to conduct home visits, to provide malaria awareness education, care of bed nets. They are also tasked with finding fever cases, testing symptomatic patients using Rapid Diagnostic Test kits, and referring the malaria-positive patients to the nearest clinic for treatment.

ROTARIANS AGAINST MALARIA (RAM) UPDATE - CONTINUED

Vanuatu

The pandemic has caused a delay in implementing a Rotary Global Grant, managed by Rotary NZ D9910, D9820 and D9810, to train and equip a national indoor residual spraying (IRS) team. To date, the project has trained two Master Trainers and 10 IRS machines and USD60,000 worth of insecticides have been purchased.

To help raise the cash component for this Global Grant, in 2020 Southern Region opened a RAWCS/RAM Vanuatu Account that received generous contributions from clubs across our Region.

Unfortunately, malaria increased in the first half of 2022 and in July 2022, the Vanuatu Ministry of Health declared a malaria outbreak, in part because COVID activities became, by order of the Director of Public Health, the main focus. Fewer malaria intervention activities being initiated, lower human resources and limited funds, led to an inevitable resurgence in reported malaria cases. A Rapid Response Program was initiated by National and Provincial malaria staff in hot spot areas that includes increasing staff; targeted indoor residual spraying; distributions of nets and community awareness activities

RAM received a request from Vanuatu to direct the raised funds to the support of some of the activities that are an integral part of the Rapid Response Program Implementation however, RAM's contributions have been delayed by natural disaster (two cyclones) and the hacking of Vanuatu Government internet systems.

An external consultant has undertaken a mid-term review of the Vanuatu Malaria program for the Vanuatu Government, to prepare the next Global Fund funding round 2024-27. RAM Committee members provided input into the review process. RAM is now working with WHO and Vanuatu malaria program to complete the Rotary GG. There have been 4 Volunteers posted from the Australian Volunteers Program who will be in Vanuatu in July 2023.

Timor Leste:


Timor Leste achieved zero indigenous malaria in 2021 and is on track to achieve WHO malaria-free status by 2025. The country's biggest threat is cross border malaria transmission from West Timor into Oecusse in Timor Leste. The two-year Rotary Global Grant to prevent re-establishment of malaria progressed well, and is managed by the RAM Timor Leste country representative from RC Darwin, D9560.

West Timor, Nusa Tenggara Timor (NTT) Province:

Indonesia shares Timor Island with Timor Leste. RAM is assisting the local Rotary Club of Kupang Central (D3420) and the Rotary Club of Hillarys (D9455) to implement a Rotary Global Grant in four districts in West Timor. One of the key activities is to train and post Village Malaria Cadres (VMCs) in two border Districts, to encourage early testing and treatment of malaria. The RAM-Global Rotary Action Group has provided top-up in funding to increase the number of trained VMCs. A second Global Grant application (led by Past RAM National Manager Dr Jenny Kerrison) for malaria activities in NTT has been finalised and submitted, led by RC West Perth and RC Kupang Central. Jenny is planning to take a small team of volunteers on RAM activities to NTT, possibly in May 2024.
