Greetings Rotarians and Friends

Oh what times we are living! Gwen and I were surprised to see how full the cafes of Mt Martha were at 7:15 on Saturday morning, we all knew there would be an influx from Melbourne, but this busy given the cold wind rain? It soon became apparent that these people were here because they still did not have electricity at home. This was the second time in less that six months that such destructive winds have blown down significant trees, power poles and damaged peoples homes. We all hope that members and friends are OK and that we are here to help each other.

Now that we are out of lockdown our committees can get back to our volunteer work without restriction. Throughout the lockdown the community service team was as busy as ever. Wayne Jenkins organised for our four park benches to be given another life. Two are going to the Community Centre off Robertson Drive and the other two to the Mount Martha Community Garden. If you get the opportunity, I encourage you to visit the Community Garden to have a look at the great work that was done. The BBQ trailer was recently upgraded with a hot water system that will see that we comply with food handling laws.

Bill Cummins and Colin Stokes have been working to make sure that all members understand Covid Safe practices when volunteering on any of our BBQs. Because we are so good at this and reliable, Bunnings have asked us to do a number of BBQs between now and Christmas. As the community opens up it is reasonable that people will be reticent to go back to the way life was almost two year ago. At the same time, the BBQs will be one of the few sources of revenue for the club to disburse to the community. Colin and Bill will be sending the BBQ protocols around to all members and will host a question and answer session, hopefully f2f, so that all members fully understand how to protect themselves and the community as we open up again.

Ann Shaw has been working with the Council who are "champing at the bit" to see development of the Bay Trail. The Council has committed \$0.5M for this project and there have been site meetings to identify development. The most important aspect of this project is the community engagement aspect that includes working with the Bunwurong, the traditional custodians of the land. The kernel of the Program is the pairing of a successful VicPol applicant, the mentee and a carefully selected Rotary person, the mentor. Note that a police member must apply to be part of the program as in this case there were 240 applicants for 25 positions.

I was honoured to be nominated for the job of mentor by senior members of our club Merv Williams and Rob Marks. My mentee is Detective Senior Sergeant Mark Patrick. Over the past 2 years we have met on many occasions coffee in hand walking the streets of Mornington and exchanging views thoughts and ideas. Our relationship has blossomed to the point that clearly, we have been good for one another. So, this mentor/mentee thing is very much about the journey as well as the key deliverables mentioned earlier.

A further part of the Program is where the mentee must produce a project that connects with and does good within the community as well as showing VicPol in a positive light. 
> Ticket sales banked to date (23/10/21) have been \$933 and 79 Raffle Books have been issued to date also.
